Fourth Annual VOICE-Out

(Victims on the Impact of Crime Event)

Brooklyn Borough Hall, April 23, 2013

On April 23, 2013, this office will host the Fourth Annual VOICE-Out (Victims on the Impact of Crime Event) at Brooklyn Borough Hall. The event was inaugurated in 2010 to recognize the strength and celebrate the voices of those Brooklyn residents whose lives have been changed by crime, and to provide them with information about resources that will better assist them in addressing the ongoing trauma created by these crimes.

This year's VOICE-Out will include all of the elements that made the previous events a success, including musical performances by members of the New York/Keystone State Boychoir and the "Voices of VOICE-Out" choir, dance performances by members of Brooklyn's Full Force Dance Repertory and powerful testimonials from several survivors of violent crime. The focus this year will be on the impact of gun violence in our community and strategies for community response to such violence.

As before, an Information Fair will be held from 2:30pm to 5:30pm outside Borough Hall. There, complainants, witnesses and their supporters can obtain information about the wide variety of victim services available throughout the borough. The VOICE-Out program will take place in the Second Floor Ceremonial Courtroom inside Borough Hall at 6pm, to be followed by a brief open-air memorial for those who recently lost their lives to gun violence.
